

In EYFS we use a 'narrative immersion' approach to teach of the 7 Areas of Learning. We use the 'Magic Story Box' technique to immerse children in a text and use drama techniques to bring the stories used to life.

In KS1 we use DEAL (Drama Engagement Active Learning) to again immerse our children in the narrative. Topics are explored through our choice of 'quality text', drama techniques and disciplinary literacy.

Our children have a school Library where they can borrow books of their own choice in each year group. Nursery have a 'Share a Book' Library where parents/ carers can come into the Nursery to read and borrow books with their child.



Our Learning Value characters, which are woven throughout everything in school, have a story each, written by one of our talented Teaching Assistants, Mrs Burrows. These stories are introduced to the children when they are in EYFS and are shared in assemblies and class story-times throughout the year. They are also on our website in the 'Tales from the Burrows' section.

We have many events and activities throughout the year in school that support and demonstrate the high profile we give reading.

Reading Parents Meeting


At the start of each new academic year each year group has a meeting for parents where our approach to reading and how children can best be supported at home is discussed.
