Key Knowledge

Identify some ways Christians celebrate Christmas/Easter/Harvest/Pentecost and some ways a festival is celebrated in another religion.

Re-tell stories connected with Christmas in relation to the above celebrations and say why these are important to believers.

Ask questions and suggest answers about stories to do with Christian festivals and a story from a festival in another religion.

Collect examples of what people do, give, sing, remember or think about the religious celebrations studied and say why they matter to believers.

Suggest meanings for some symbols and actions used in religious celebrations including Easter and Christmas.
